FROM THE 6TH GRADE TEAM

Math

We will be starting Topic 4 that involves working with equality and equations. We will learn the different properties that go along with equality and equations and then work on solving equations involving the four main operations. After our topic on equality we will begin Topic 5 that introduced rules for divisibility and fractions. Topic 5 will be a great lead into our next few topics that deal with fractions and all their operations.

Social Studies

Sixth graders have finished studying the Old and New Stone Ages and how agriculture led to the development of civilizations. We will be moving on to Mesopotamia where we will learn about the civilizations of Sumer, Babylon and Assyria. Students will learn about famous individuals like King Sargon, Hammurabi and his code of laws. We will finish the Mesopotamia unit in November and move on to Egypt.

Reading/Language Arts

Reading classes continue to learn new comprehension strategies in Making Meaning. Included in this month will be asking questions before, during, and after reading passages, stories, and novels. Also, extended reading responses will be used to respond to some of the literature in class. A part of these responses will delve into making meaningful connections to the text and supporting these connections with extensions. Another aspect of Making Meaning is the cooperative structures used to focus on social development in class. Listening and speaking will include (1) think-pair-share, (2) turn-to-your-partner, and (3) ways to respectfully disagree and agree with classmates. Students continue to use writing connections in their reading logs or journals as they read for enjoyment and appreciate quality literature. Ever present is the need for students to apply word knowledge and new vocabulary to their reading and writing. In Language Arts, writing traits include ideas, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, and conventions. Aligning the traits of writing with the revision and editing process is important as we write persuasive essays and review narrative and expository writing. Other writing will include narrative dialogue as well as writing opportunities using figurative language such as similes, metaphors, and personification. Students should strive to use correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation in all of their written work for their best effort at communication and presentation.

6th Grade Science

The 6th grade science classes have spent the last several weeks studying about water and the atmosphere. We will begin our study of weather next week. Hopefully, the sixth graders will gain a better understanding of how meteorologists predict the weather. We will also be studying tornados, hurricanes, and other types of storms. Several activities and projects are planned for this unit. The Ocean will be our final topic before the end of the semester.

FROM THE 7TH GRADE TEAM

Science

Did you know the human body is made up of trillions of cells? Within each microscopic cell are many structures. These structures carry out all the functions that keep us alive. We enjoyed using the microscopes to look at cells and creating 3D cell models. Now we will look at the processes cells use to sustain life and how they replace themselves through mitosis and meiosis. We will also be looking at one-celled organisms through the microscopes if we can get them to hold still long enough to see!

Math

As we move ahead into second quarter, we will begin a long unit centered on geometric shapes and geometric vocabulary. Students continue to excel in their study teams and are demonstrating a very strong work ethic to work cooperatively and solve difficult problems. Keep up the great work students!!

FROM THE 8TH GRADE TEAM

Reading

In reading classes, students are using new skills to help with comprehension. In the previous unit, we read and discussed non-fiction informational text. Through the processes of “Turn to Your Partner”, “Heads Together”, and other communication skills, students practiced questioning skills, identified text features and how they add to their knowledge, and learned to decode words to infer meaning. We are reading fiction short stories and short dramas in preparation for studying *The Giver* by Lois Lowry. Ask your student about these devices and how they are used in these stories as well as other literature.

Language Arts

In language arts, the emphasis is still on writing. Our focus for this unit is the use of voice and making good word choices. Through note-taking, students have been determining the elements of a very good five-paragraph essay. They will be writing essays on topics of interest to them, using the skills that they have been taught. In Word Study, students are beginning the third unit – Lessons 9-12. They are quickly realizing that they can identify word definitions through the knowledge of roots and affixes. This helps both their reading and writing skills.

FROM THE 8TH GRADE TEAM continued**Science**

Currently in 8th grade science we are finishing up our unit on motion and speed. We have learned velocity, time and acceleration are related. We have represented on a line graph both the speed and acceleration of an object. We have identified the difference between positive and negative acceleration. And, we have calculated the speed, velocity and acceleration of objects in real world situations using the appropriate mathematical formula.

In the coming weeks we will be investigating Newton's Laws of Motion. We will learn that these laws explain the movement of all of the objects in our day to day lives. We will understand the natural forces that cause objects to change their motion such as gravity and friction. And, we will apply mathematical calculations to every day situations to find unknown values of force, mass or acceleration.

I would also like to encourage all parents to ask their students about the things we are doing in school, to keep checking assignment books and grades on Powerschool. As you know middle school students are not fully independent and need support from home studying for tests, completing projects and finding purpose in the lessons they are taught. Thank you for your support and your fantastic kids.

VISUAL ARTS—Mrs. Sorensen

Like the squirrels, GKMS art students are very active this season. Each session of each grade level enjoys the same curriculum for that grade, but some of our inspirations change with seasonal images, available materials and the tenor of each class group.

Sixth graders are enjoying their special visual awareness eye witness murals that change at the beginning of each session and develop over the course of the first week in class. The murals begin simply, but build in complexity each day. The students like playing an eye witness game of "What's Different?" for a few minutes each day.

Seventh grade visual arts class is diverse. While many of the seventh grade projects this semester are based in drawing, there is a variety of concepts that diversify students' ability to employ these methods to create a two-dimensional image. The second half of the year in seventh grade is devoted expanding the students' knowledge of creative processes. These processes include: relief, mask sculpting, printmaking and metal-working.

In eighth grade, special activities include understanding advanced creative concepts and articulation about images through writing, for some, in their journals each week. The eighth grade art curriculum stresses the concept or idea behind an image as the most important and varied aspect of creating.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS—Mrs. Sorensen

Put the “WIN” in winter by preparing your environment in the following ways:

Weather strip around your exterior doors and windows. There is a variety of easy to use products available at all home improvement stores for this purpose.

Insulate basement windows from winter winds with hay bales placed in front of exposed glass. Use the hay or straw to mulch your plantings in the spring.

Natural objects from your yard can “warm-up” and cozy-up an inside space for the season. Clip and arrange dried plants and interesting sticks in vases or over cool lights. Place colorful leaves in a basket or bowl along with apples and pears, squash and gourds. Don’t forget the pine cones! All shapes of evergreen cones add a wonderful smell and texture to seasonal settings. They can even serve as a texture base for a peanut butter and seed feeder.

Take plants and bulbs in for wintering-over for spring replanting. A simple plant light on a timer hung over the plant area can help regulate growth and the flowering photo period of annuals like geraniums, too. I have one planter of geraniums that will be into their fourth season this winter inside.

Engage the whole family in caring for your living space both inside and out. Home is where people gather to enjoy each other, so make it comfortable.

Rake fallen leaves under bushes to protect plant branches from harsh winter winds and for early spring composted nutrients when plants need a kick start for the long growing season.
